THE HISTORIC DISTRICTS COUNCIL

Founded over 25 years ago as a committee of the Municipal Arts Society, the Historic Districts Council is an independent not-for-profit organization that serves as the advocate for New York City's designated historic districts and for neighborhoods meriting preservation. As the only city-wide grassroots preservation organization, the Council is dedicated to protecting the integrity of New York City's Landmarks Law and to furthering the preservation ethic.

THE NEIGHBORHOOD PRESERVATION CENTER

Currently being created in the historic Ernest Flagg rectory at St. Mark's Church-in-the-Bowery, the Neighborhood Preservation Center will serve both fledging and established historic preservation organizations across the five boroughs of New York, as well as encourage grassroots groups involved in the ongoing improvement of the immediate neighborhood. The Center, the first resource of its kind in the city, will welcome and assist all who seek to preserve the diverse cultural heritage and historic architecture of New York City's many fine neighborhoods. It will offer meeting rooms for community groups, and essential services such as a mailing address, fax, and telephone - for preservation organizations without a base, as well as a preservation referral service designed to assist laypeople and professionals interested in a wide range of preservation issues. Funding for the Neighborhood Preservation Center has been generously provided by the LuEsther T. Mertz Advised Fund at the New York Community Trust, the New York State Council on the Arts, the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission, and the Samuel H. Kress Foundation.

The Historic Districts Council will be one of three preservation organizations to take up residence in the Center in spring 1999. Along with fellow residents, the Greenwich Village Society for Historic Preservation and the St. Mark's Historic Landmarks Fund, the Council looks forward to its exciting future at St. Mark's.
