

Grassroots Preservation Awards

Successful historic preservation efforts in New York City require collaboration among many parties, including the public, government agencies and private sector entities. Without popular support, even the most well-intentioned and farsighted public policy cannot be implemented, and without governmental guidance even the most organized and well-funded private efforts are doomed to fail.

With these awards, the Historic Districts Council (HDC) seeks to recognize, honor and encourage public participation in the preservation process. These are the individuals and organizations that, with their time, effort and support, move the preservation collaboration forward. By working with, encouraging and cajoling public decision-makers, these grassroots preservationists form the foundation of all our work. In 2000, HDC gave the first annual Grassroots Preservation Awards to recognize such outstanding efforts.

In addition, the awards include two special categories. The Friend from the Media Award and the Mickey Murphy Award. The Friend from the Media Award honors and acknowledges the dedication of the press for encouraging the cause of historic preservation throughout the city. Without support from the media, few community-based preservation efforts would ever bear fruit. The Mickey Murphy Award is a lifetime-achievement recognition that honors the late Mary Ellen (Mickey) Murphy, a longtime passionate preservationist and HDC board member.

Guardians of the Guardian is a group of concerned stakeholders who successfully advocated for the landmark designation of the Angel Guardian Home in Dyker Heights, Brooklyn in 2020. The home, designed by George Streeton in 1899, is an ornate Beaux Arts and Renaissance Revival structure originally built as an orphanage. The Guardians became concerned about the site in 2017 when the site was rumored to be closing, which could lead to its demolition and redevelopment. The Guardians advocated for preservation over the subsequent three years and convinced the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission to make it the first Landmark in the Dyker Heights neighborhood. The group continues to monitor the redevelopment of the structure and grounds, as well as advocate for additional Landmarks in the community.





The Tin Pan Alley American Popular Music Project commemorates and continues the legacy of Tin Pan Alley, the culturally rich and diverse birthplace of American Popular Music on 28th Street between Broadway and 6th Avenue in New York City. Through telling the stories of the songwriters, music publishers and the songs that formed the sound and industry of American Popular Music in the first half of the 20th Century, they connect people with the power of music as an essential element of New York City and American cultural history. Since 2015, the Project, and its predecessor Save Tin Pan Alley, strenuously advocated for the recognition and designation of the block, a campaign that was successfully achieved in December 2019, with the landmark designation of five historic buildings at the heart of Tin Pan Alley, home to more than 75 musician and publishers' offices during the height of the area's significance.



Maria Torres, is the President, Co-founder, and **COO of The Point Community Development Corporation**. In September of 1994, Ms. Torres along with Paul Lipson, Mildred Ruiz, and Steven Sapp founded The Point, a non-profit organization dedicated to youth development and the cultural and economic revitalization of the Hunts Point section of the South Bronx. The Point works with its neighbors to celebrate the life and creativity of the Hunts Point community, an area traditionally defined solely in terms of its poverty, crime rate, poor schools, and sub-standard housing. For The Point, the area's residents, their talents and their aspirations are Hunts Point's greatest assets. In her time at The Point, Maria has championed many community initiatives including the South Bronx Greenway, the South Bronx Community Resiliency Agenda Lab, and the purchase and cleanup of a waterfront brownfield site on The Bronx River, repurposing it as a public arts and environmental space. Among her recent accomplishments have been facilitating tours and programs as part of Hunts Point's selection as one of HDC's Six to Celebrate in 2019 and successfully advocating for the designation of Manida Street, adjacent to The Point, as New York City's 150th Historic District in 2020.

Mickey Murphy Lifetime Achievement Award

Penelope Bareau has been a longtime and steadfast advocate for historic preservation in the Village and New York City at large for more than thirty years. With a background as a writer, editor, published author, and interior designer, she served as a trustee of the Greenwich Village Society for Historic Preservation for 25 years (1991-2016) and on the Board of Directors of the Historic Districts Council (HDC) (2001 to present), where she currently acts as Secretary. She was a founding member of the Save Gansevoort Task Force, which campaigned for historic district designation by the Landmarks Preservation Commission, which was granted in 2003. She has served on HDC's Public Review Committee since 2001, providing invaluable and carefully crafted feedback on thousands of proposals for landmarked buildings. She also served as an editor and writer of HDC's publication District Lines for five years, penning dozens of articles on significant topics such as the landmarks hardship provision and has written for 6sqft, City Realty, and others.



ABOUT THE HISTORIC DISTRICTS COUNCIL

The Historic Districts Council (HDC) is the citywide advocate for New York's designated historic districts and individual landmarks and for neighborhoods and buildings meriting preservation. HDC is dedicated to defending the integrity of the New York City Landmarks Law and to furthering the preservation ethic. This mission is accomplished through ongoing programs of hands-on assistance to more than 500 local community and neighborhood groups and through public-policy initiatives, publications, educational outreach and sponsorship of community events.

The core belief of HDC is that the preservation and enhancement of New York City's historic resources – its neighborhoods, buildings, parks and public spaces – are central to the continued success of the city. Founded in 1970 as a coalition of community groups from New York City's designated historic districts, HDC was incorporated as a nonprofit organization in 1985 and has grown to become the foremost citywide voice for historic preservation. Following its mandate of community-based preservation advocacy, HDC works continuously to broaden and educate the preservation constituency – from producing zoning and architectural surveys of unprotected historic neighborhoods, to meeting with legislators and city officials, to creating educational programs on the techniques and strategies of neighborhood preservation.

HDC's small professional staff is guided by its dedicated Boards of Directors and Advisers, whose members represent more than two dozen neighborhoods and are drawn from the fields of architecture, education, history, marketing, law, design, public relations, journalism and community activism. Their collective expertise aids community groups in their campaigns to preserve the sense of place that characterizes the city's diverse historic neighborhoods. Working with these neighborhood partners, HDC has been instrumental in preserving historic buildings and communities across the five boroughs.
